Industry Sector

- The Bluegrass Healthcare Consortium met on November 16th.
- Staff is currently working with Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government (LFUCG) to implement a CDL initiative to train unemployed individuals who are qualified to become Bus Drivers for LFUCG.
- Staff submitted a proposal for H1B Grant on November 17th.
- The General Electric Lexington Lamp Plant reported that there have been seven new full time hires that are making \$14.80/hour. These new hires are a result of the Embassy Suites hiring event coordinated by the Central Kentucky Career Center in Lexington.

One-Stops

- The Career Center in Danville reported a number of companies that will either be expanding or opening in the upcoming year.
- The Career Center in Georgetown has began offering Partner's for Success training in order to better educate staff on the services offered through the Career Centers.
- Two new staff joined the Career Center in Lexington, Kelly Merin with the Office for Vocational Rehabilitation and Wade Outland with Adult Education.
- The Career Center in Winchester continues to offer Re-Employment Workshops monthly with the success improving each month.
- The Mobile Career Center conducted 5 Resume Workshops and Self-Registration classes in November assisting a total of 84 individuals.
